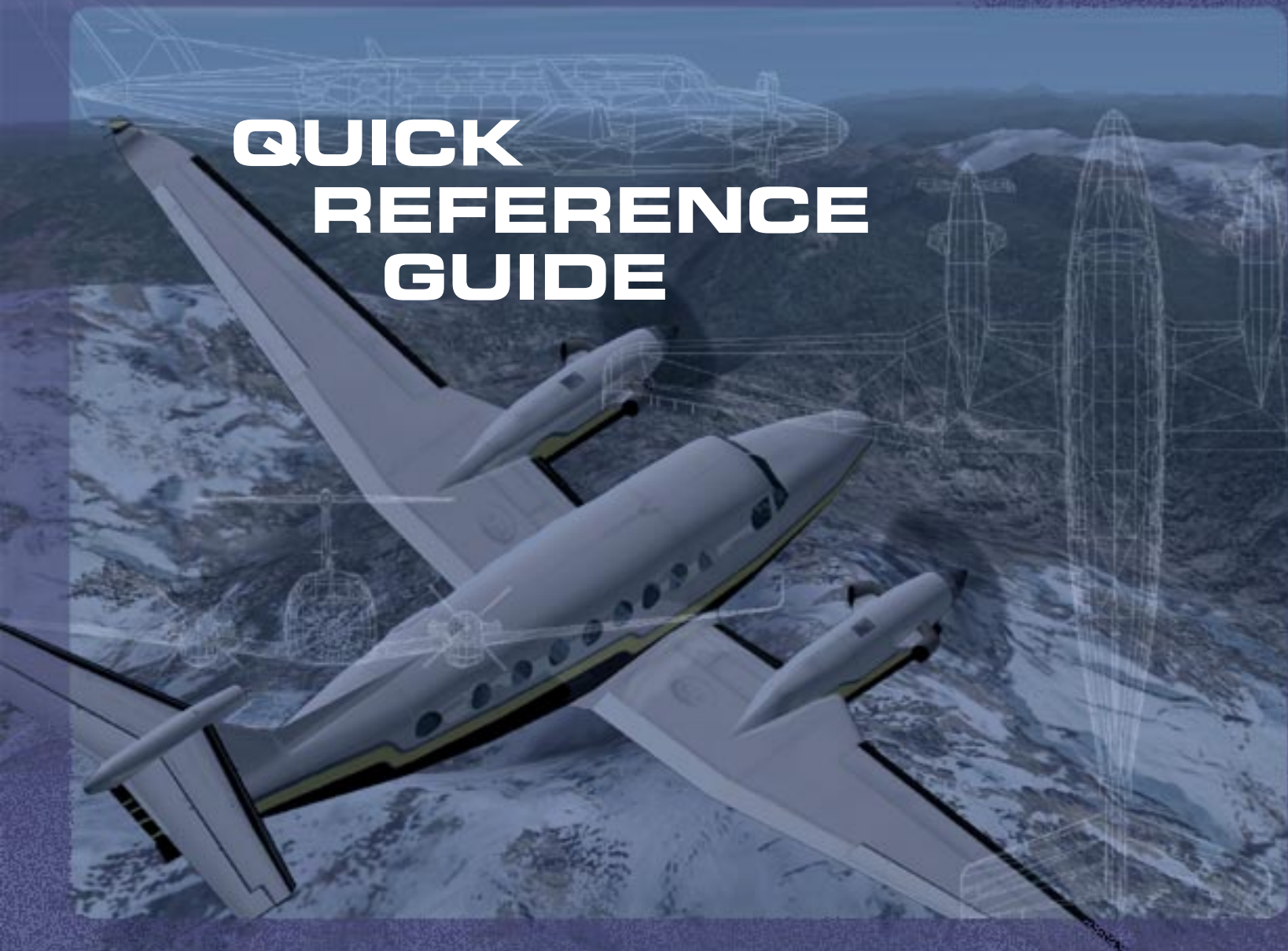

HOW DO I...?

Choose or change my aircraft, location, weather, or time of flight?

To choose your aircraft, location, weather, or time of flight *before* beginning a flight:

1. Choose **Create a Flight** on the Welcome page of Flight Simulator 2002.
2. You'll be given four options. Choose **Current Aircraft**, **Current Location**, **Current Weather**, or **Current Time**. Click the **Change** tab beneath the option you've chosen.
3. Follow the onscreen prompts.
4. Click **OK**.
5. Click the **Fly Now** tab when you're ready to fly.

To change your aircraft, location, weather, or time of flight *during* a flight:

To change your aircraft:

1. Select the **Aircraft** menu located at the top of your screen.
2. Choose **Select Aircraft**.
3. Follow the onscreen prompts.

To change your location:

1. Select the **World** menu located at the top of your screen.
2. Choose **Go to Airport**.
3. Follow the onscreen prompts.

To change your weather:

1. Select the **World** menu located at the top of your screen.
2. Choose **Weather**.
3. Follow the onscreen prompts.

To change the time of your flight:

1. Select the **World** menu located at the top of your screen.
2. Choose **Time and Season**.
3. Follow the onscreen prompts.

Engine Commands (Num Lock OFF)

Engine Autostart	CTRL + E
Cut Throttle	F1
Reverse Thrust (turboprops/jets)	F2 (hold down)
Decrease Throttle	F2 or Num Pad 3
Increase Throttle	F3 or Num Pad 9
Full Throttle	F4
Reheat/Afterburner On/Off	SHIFT + F4
Set Prop RPM to Low	CTRL + F1
Decrease Prop RPM	CTRL + F2
Increase Prop RPM	CTRL + F3
Set Prop RPM to High	CTRL + F4
Set Mixture to Idle Cutoff	CTRL + SHIFT + F1
Lean Mixture	CTRL + SHIFT + F2
Enrich Mixture	CTRL + SHIFT + F3
Set Mixture to Rich ..	CTRL + SHIFT + F4
Carburetor Heat On/Off	H

Full Screen Mode
(no menus or taskbar).. **ALT + ENTER**

(in Full Screen mode) **ALT**

Look Around **SHIFT + Num Pad 1-9**
Cycle Views (Cockpit, Tower,
Track, Spot Plane) **S**
Display/Hide Additional Panel
Windows (radios, engine
controls, GPS, etc.) **SHIFT + 1-9**
Display/Hide Kneeboard **F10**
Cycle Coordinates
Frame Rate **SHIFT + Z**

View Window **[(LEFT BRACKET)**
Create New Top-Down View

Basic Slew Commands (Num Lock OFF)

Slew Mode On/Off **Y**
Move Forward **Num Pad 8**
Move Backward **Num Pad 2**
Move Left **Num Pad 4**
Move Right **Num Pad 6**
Freeze Horizontal
Movement **Num Pad 5**
Move Up Slowly **Q**
Move Up Quickly **F4**
Move Down Slowly **A**
Move Down Quickly **F1**
Freeze Vertical Movement **F2**

Air Traffic Control Commands

View ATC Menu **~ (Press SHIFT
plus the key above
the TAB key.)**

Number Pad numbers will not work for ATC. Use the numbers at the top of your keyboard, and refer to the onscreen ATC menu for more information.

Numbers above 9: Say each digit. For example, when calling air traffic control and relaying your aircraft's callsign, state, "This is Cessna Niner Five Juliet."
